- There are only 5 regular polyhedrons.


 Plato was influenced by Pythagorean, who is considered the real father of the theory of Platonic bodies.

Trial of Socrates

- Socrates was accused of not believing in the same gods as the government at that time.
- He was anti-democratic, and much of the city was against him at the time he was 70 years old.

The Trial of Socrates

- He was brought to court to argue his case in front of a jury of 500.
- Once the hearing was over, the jury was asked to vote, without deliberation.
- The vote was 280 to 220.

Guilty

- In that time, the government was not allowed to kill a citizen.
- Sometimes they would take their citizenship away then kill them.
- The jury then must have to consider a punishment.

- The accusers wanted death!
- He was actually asked what his punishment should be.
- One option was to go in exile.

Socrates suggestion

- He gave a sarcastic suggestion and thought he should be rewarded for his actions.
- He proposed a modest sum of money for his punishment.


- The jury had to decide death or a monetary punishment.
